ABOUT HAMMOND

Previously known as Hammond Academy, Hammond School is an independent, co-educational day school founded in 1966. The school enrolls college-bound students in prekindergarten through grade 12 who are bright, talented, possess good character, and are willing to perform in a rigorous academic environment. Approximately 21% of students receive need-based aid, which is determined by the School Scholarship Services of Princeton, NJ.

Hammond does not discriminate on the basis of color, nationality, or ethnic origin in any of its policies, practices, or procedures. Hammond has a faculty and staff of 155 men and women. The student:teacher ratio is nine to one.

Hammond places an emphasis on global studies and experiential education with travel both nationally and abroad. Upper School students participate in extensive extracurricular opportunities in athletics, arts, and service. 93% of students participate in athletics and have won 161 state championships since the school's founding. Hammond also has a diverse and prolific performing and visual arts community which provides an opportunity for choral tours, drama productions, dance performances, and art exhibits. Although there is no community service requirement, students are highly involved in philanthropy and humanitarian work to include our Dance Marathon.

ACCREDITATION

Hammond is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and Southern Association of Independent Schools.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Hammond's emphasis on forward-thinking extends from the faculty to the student body. Beginning in the earliest grades, curricular and co-curricular programs are crafted to help prepare students for future grades, each level building on the former. Programs unique to Hammond differentiate the educational experience from other schools.

• Global Studies Program

Hammond annually selects a country for year-long study that supplements the curriculum across disciplines. A faculty member from each division of the school spends several weeks during the summer in the selected country where they study the culture, history, and language, helping them bring the country to life for our students.

• Hammond Abroad

Hammond Abroad offers a formative summer opportunity to rising 10th, 11th, and 12th graders. Students engage in an interdisciplinary program that explores the connection between at least two academic disciplines. Classroom work and travel abroad complete this experiential program.

• Experiential Education/Field Studies

Throughout the Hammond student's Middle and Upper School years, opportunities for experiential education abound. Class trips include North Carolina whitewater rafting, college visits, Costa Rica, and a senior outdoor expedition.

• Public Policy and Social Change Signature Program

Public Policy and Social Change is available to students in 12th grade. Students in the program focus attention on a particular platform issue and give a presentation their senior year on the issue or topic of choice. In 2025, eleven students graduated with this distinction.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum at Hammond School is a demanding academic program designed to prepare our students for university coursework. Because of this rigorous academic focus, when evaluating a Hammond transcript, it is important to take into account the challenging nature of all coursework offered at Hammond School. Standard level courses, as well as those designated Honors or AP, are demanding in quality, content and design. Enrollment in standard level coursework does not signal a lack of academic rigor or challenge.

COURSE LOAD

Ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade students typically enroll in six courses per semester. Twelfth grade students typically enroll in five courses per semester unless special permission is granted to do otherwise.

HONORS AND AP

Enrollment in Honors and Advanced Placement coursework requires faculty endorsement. The only Honors courses typically available to Middle School students are Algebra I Honors and Geometry Honors. Enrollment in AP coursework is an honor typically reserved for juniors, seniors, and a limited number of sophomores. Students enrolled in AP courses are required to take AP exams.

GRADING SCALE/GPA/CLASS RANK

Hammond utilizes the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale, which designates the quality-point range for each numeric **unweighted grade** and **gives weighted credit on GPA value only**. Honors courses are weighted an additional 0.5 point and AP/Post-AP courses are weighted an additional 1 point. Credit earned through other institutions does not affect Hammond GPA and does not appear on Hammond transcripts.

The South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy determines class rank. While Hammond has a policy on the academic ranking of students, rank is not used for the purposes of college admission. It is our belief that rank neither provides a valid measure of performance nor offers a true distinction between members of a highly-talented class. We do offer other data that should assist in the evaluation of performance. We humbly ask that admissions staff take into consideration the rigor of curriculum at Hammond as evidenced by class statistics and college matriculations.

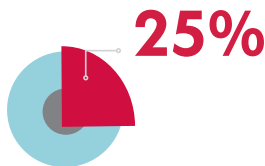

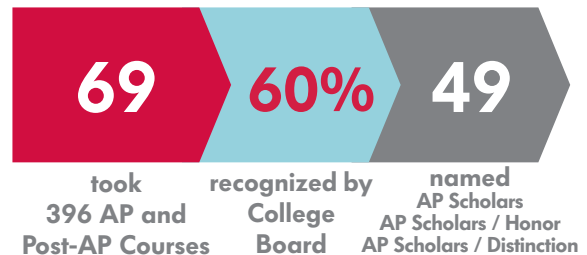
